We had a variety of speakers and events over the year. They included:

In May, we celebrated our 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary! Mark Weston, British Horse Society Director of Access presented Eve with an Access Award and the NLBS with a certificate of recognition for the 20 years the NLBS had been in existence. Everyone enjoyed the special cake!!

The Annual Ride was held in May and was enjoyed by the 35 riders who took part. We hope for more participants for the 2018 ride that we are going to run in conjunction with Cumbria Bridleways Society and The Rosemere Cancer Foundation.

We had an informative presentation by Rebecca Sisson in September about the subtle signs an uncomfortable horse might show.

#### *Bridleway News:*

- i. In September, several members helped clear the bridleway at the Lune Millennium Path in Halton.
- ii. There is a new Bridleway at Wray – a new circular route near Lower Broadwood Farm. Thanks to Michael Helme for his work on this.
- iii. Michael has also informed us of two proposed bridleways, one from Mill Head to Warton and the other in the AONB, just north west of Gait Barrows. Also, Forest of Bowland AONB have received funding for a full time Rights of Way person. NLBS has pledged to support these initiatives in any way we can.
- iv. We are still working on a list of potential bridleways claims and will be arranging a meeting to further this work.
- v. We are still waiting for Lancashire County Council to make a legal Order to revise the Definitive Map and mark the route through Thwaite Brow Woods and Mount Pleasant in Bolton le Sands as part- bridleway, part by-way and part-public road. It was in a queue in Lancashire's legal department, but we have heard recently from David Goode that progress on making Orders is now going well so this one should be made soon. Thanks to Ailsa Gibson for following this up.
- vi. BHS Road Safety Leaflets have been distributed to garages etc.

### Minutes of general meeting held on 8 May 2018

3. **Minutes of Last Meeting:** were confirmed as a true and accurate record.

4. **Matters Arising:** None.
5. **New Data Protection Regulations** – new regulations come into force at the end of May. The Group are in the process of ascertaining requirements to conform with this legislation and an email will be circulated shortly which will require members to respond. It would be greatly appreciated if members could provide a prompt response.
6. **Dynamo Cycle Campaign** – there are plans by the Council for a Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan for Lancaster to be drawn up and Dynamo are to be consulted on this. Dynamo are asking their members for ideas of what infrastructure to include in a 'wish list' so Eve is going to write to the Group to put forward a case for the inclusion of horse riding in this plan.
7. **Bridleway news:**
  - (i) Bridleway clearance – at the end of April volunteers from NLBS joined members from Cumbria Bridleways to clear an overgrown bridleway near Endmoor.
  - (ii) Gates in need of repair – the Group have been notified of several gates in the Tunstall area and one in the Yealand area that are in need of repair. A local contractor has been instructed to carry out the necessary repairs.

  - (i) *Towpath Trail Project* Lancaster Canal Regeneration Partnership (LCRP) are developing a Towpath Trail between Kendal and Lancaster, improving access, signage and interpretation. They are holding Roadshows around the area to share their improvement ideas and find out about the issues you see on Lancaster Canal.
